SeaWind Class Owners Association - Constitution

Article I. Name

This organization shall be known as the SeaWind Class Owners association, hereinafter referred to as the COA.

Article II. Emblem

The emblem shall be an S as described in the Class Rules.

Article III. Object

To promote SeaWind Class Racing under uniform rules and to maintain the one design nature of the SeaWind class yacht.

Article IV. Policy

To keep the cost of owning and racing the SeaWind at a minimum level, in order that the SeaWind may be available to the largest number of owners and to maintain a strictly one design class in those factors which affect both ease of kit assembly and sailing performance of the yacht.

Article V. Jurisdiction

The Constitution, By-Laws and Class Rules are binding on all COA members.

Article VI. Membership

Membership in the COA is open to all owners of SeaWind Class yachts. Application must be made to the Secretary of the COA.

Article VII. Organization

The SeaWind COA is formed under the auspices of the American Model Yachting Association, hereinafter referred to as the AMYA, and will comply with any and all provisions that are required to maintain AMYA approval.

Article VIII. Administration

Officers of the COA shall consist of a Class Secretary and a Board of Directors. Structure, election and duties shall be as prescribed in the By-Laws.

Article IX. Regions

There shall be six Regions, which shall be the same as defined by the AMYA.

Article X. Ratification

Initial ratification of the Constitution, By-Laws and Class Rules will be by simple majority vote of the Board of Directors.

Article XI. Amendments

Amendments to the Constitution, By-Laws and Class Rules shall be accomplished as prescribed in the By-Laws.
